

My position has allowed me to close equity-gaps, solve educational and financial barriers, stay institutionally focused, remain systematically aware and provide equity minded practices in meeting diverse adult student needs based on their histories, giving them access to online resources and different starting points.

Additionally, I have addressed inequities that interfere with learning opportunities and outcomes for first-generation adult students of color as I promote diversity, inclusion, social justice, anti-racism and racial equity while dismantling racial barriers and pipelines within the city of Riverside, CA. Overall, I plan to ensure educational equity by creating student-centered programs that will encourage adult learners of color to overcome past obstacles, master current job-related skills and enroll in colleges and universities.


