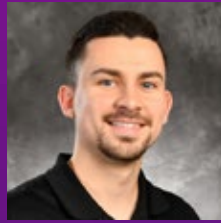
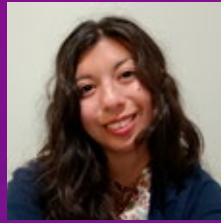

These days, I work as a web designer at Showit, where I'm helping lead a complete rebrand alongside an awesome team of creatives. I also run a freelance business, collaborating with clients to bring their ideas to life through thoughtful design and storytelling. At the core of everything I do is a deep belief that creativity is a gift from the Creator, the original artist and designer. My faith fuels my work and reminds me that making beautiful, meaningful things isn't just a job. It's an act of worship and a reflection of something much bigger. Whether designing a website, capturing a wedding or illustrating just for fun, I see creativity not just as a skill, but as a sacred calling.

MOST SIGNIFICANT CAREER MILESTONES

I've found that my career has been less about flashy moments and more about faithful steps: the quiet wins, open doors and unexpected turns that shaped the path I'm on today. It began with an internship at a local design firm, where I got my first real taste of professional creative work. That early opportunity sparked something in me, and not long after, I took a leap of faith into full-time freelance design.

That decision led to my first major client, a downtown Phoenix church called Roosevelt Community Church, where I refined my skills through consistent, mission-driven work. One of the most meaningful milestones came from photographing my first 100 weddings. Being trusted to capture such deeply personal, once-in-a-lifetime moments taught me more than just visual storytelling. It shaped my understanding of empathy, timing and the value of creative work in people's lives.

I've also worked as an art director and production designer on several commercial shoots for Portacool, an international cooling company. And now, at Showit, I get to work with a team of talented creatives to build tools that inspire others to create. I love being part of a company whose mission is to cultivate the creativity inside every person.

CAREER HISTORY

My professional design career kicked off while I was still at GCU. In 2016, I was headhunted by a local design firm, Boom Digitus, where I started as a paid intern and quickly evolved into a part-time designer role. Around that same time, I began picking up independent design and photography projects, laying the foundation for what would eventually become a thriving freelance business.

After graduation, I returned to GCU to serve as a university counselor while working toward my master's degree. Then in 2019, I took a leap of faith and stepped into freelance design full-time, an endeavor I continue to this day.

Over the last five years, I've had the opportunity to collaborate with a wide range of companies, creatives and entrepreneurs, creating physical and digital designs that are just as strategic as they are beautiful. Through those projects, and a healthy dose of networking, I eventually landed a spot on the marketing team at Showit, a small-but-mighty software-as-a-service company based in Chandler, Arizona. Showit's code-free, drag-and-drop web builder now powers tens of thousands of websites. It's been an incredible place to grow, design and create alongside an amazing team.

IMPACT ON FIELD

I believe creativity is most powerful when it's shared, not hoarded. Over the last eight years, I've had the privilege of mentoring young photographers who've gone on to build successful businesses of their own. Watching their creativity take root and flourish has been one of the most rewarding parts of my journey.

I've also served on the leadership team for the Spark Conference, a multi-day event that brings together design and branding professionals from around the world to grow, connect and elevate their businesses. It's been an incredible space for building community and investing in the future of the design industry.

As a creative professional, I strive to listen well, serve humbly and help clients not just meet their goals, but sometimes discover them along the way. I bring my vision and experience to the table, but my priority is always to put the client first.

One of my greatest joys? Using my design and storytelling skills to serve churches across the Valley. Whether through visuals, media or brand support, I've been honored to help elevate the way the gospel is communicated — with clarity, beauty and creativity. For me, having an impact isn't about going viral. It's about showing up with integrity, doing good work and helping others find their voice along the way.

AWARDS, ACCOLADES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

My creative journey started early. In 2012, I was the youngest artist ever accepted into the One Man's Treasure Sustainable Art Challenge, where I went on to win Best in Show. Shortly after, I received the first-place Judge's Choice Award in the Young Playwrights Festival for a play I wrote, directed and acted in.

In college, I was honored to receive Best Story in the 2017 48-Hour Film Challenge and earn a spot on GCU's President's List four years in a row before graduating summa cum laude. During my time at GCU, I also served as a head life leader, a role that dramatically shaped my leadership style.

And while those accomplishments look good on paper, my real crowning achievements call me "Dad."

ADVICE

It was jump-started by simply saying yes to an internship. Every major milestone since? The direct result of a hundred "yesses" and staying open to where God was leading.

Don't underestimate the power of networking. By that, I mean real, intentional relationship-building. It's not about shaking hands and swapping LinkedIn profiles. It's about showing up, being dependable and investing in people for the long haul.

And don't wait around for someone to teach you. Be curious. Relentless. You're in charge of your own education. Always be learning, experimenting and leveling up, even if no one's assigning the homework.

Success won't always look like you expected it to, and that's okay. Your job isn't to predict the path. It's to walk it with courage, creativity and conviction. The rest will come. Seek Jesus, act with integrity and the rest will sort itself out, seriously. Character will take you farther than talent ever could.

PROFESSIONAL BIO:

My name is Destiny Bradd, and I am the CEO and founder of Girl-tivities, a social event company for women in Arizona. We create a safe place for women to connect while doing activities such as fitness, crafts, socials and workshops. I started my business while I was a student at GCU as a passion project. Ever since my first test event, I have not stopped hosting events. I am a community leader, public speaker and team manager. I enjoy a challenge and have had so much fulfillment in building up a community of women locally for the past three years.

MOST SIGNIFICANT CAREER MILESTONES

Last year, in 2024, Girl-tivities and I accomplished some milestones. We were invited on two news stations, FOX10 and GMAZ Channel 3, for an interview about why I started Girl-tivities and what we are doing in the community for women.^{1,2,3} At the start of the year, we officially became a trademarked brand and started to fully expand all areas of the business, from memberships, partnerships, retreats and the monthly events themselves. We have hosted events monthly of 40-100 women in attendance and even a retreat in Zion National Park with 22 women, half of whom flew in from other states all over America.

CAREER HISTORY

In my younger years, I was always getting involved in the community in my own way; from leadership projects in community college to volunteering in my free time. I knew I wanted to make a real impact in the world. During my youth, I had internships and jobs in many areas, from hospitality to administration to retail. I knew I wanted to start my own business one day, so I attempted to learn aspects of how a business runs from each position I held. I had no professional experience in event planning prior to my company; however, it was a natural gift I had growing up and throwing events in my teenage years for friends and family.

IMPACT ON FIELD

I have impacted the way that others view a “business.” Girl-tivities is such a fun environment. However, from the very beginning, I have always treated it as a professional business instead of just a fun social club. I believe this is part of my success and why I am where I am today. I have also seen many new girl groups pop up around the Valley with similar events, but I do not view them as competition since they cannot recreate who I am and my organization. Rather, I view it as a compliment that I have inspired many others to also create a safe place for women to meet each other.

On a personal level, I get involved with many other communities and groups, from being a member of Arizona Entrepreneurs, women's groups and a social volleyball league with PHX Fray. On a business level, our community is huge. We partner with 10+ businesses for each month's event, including photographers, photobooths, sponsors, vendors, venues, activity leaders and more. We even have a Girl-tivities directory, where local businesses can register to be a partner of ours and our members can get discounts to local businesses for all their needs – health, fitness, fashion, automotive, food, drink and more.

LEADERSHIP STYLE

I have built my company from the ground up. Starting it entirely alone, I quickly realized I would need help in this journey. For the past two years, I have had interns (some from GCU) whom I recruited to help with things like social media, community building and partner/sponsor relations. I am currently hiring an operations manager so that I can work on doing more expansive projects as the CEO, rather than day-to-day tasks. Not only do I lead my events team with weekly meetings, but I also lead the entire community through each event. Whether we are doing a fitness class, craft, workshop or social, I am on the microphone making sure everyone is informed on what we are doing and why we are here.

ADVICE

I would advise any current student not to waste their time and their resources while at college. So many students say, "After I graduate, I want to do..." How about now, while you have the mentors and the peers around you? Get that internship, apply for that job or start that business. The best time is now. You don't have to have everything figured out; you can figure it out along the way.

PROFESSIONAL BIO:

I am a Board-Certified Music Therapist (MT-BC) based in the East Bay Area of Northern California. I specialize in mental health, multiple disabilities and dementia. Currently, I work as a quality-of-life engagement specialist with Sage Eldercare's Hummingbird Project, where I provide music therapy and engage in therapeutic activities with older adults in one-on-one sessions. I also work as a private practice music therapist with local clients, mainly children and adults with intellectual, developmental, neurological and/or physical disabilities and older adults with dementia, such as Alzheimer's. I hold a Master of Science in Mental Health and Wellness with an Emphasis in Integrated Health from GCU. Additionally, I have completed a Bachelor of Music in Music Therapy at the University of the Pacific with a Minor in Speech-Language Pathology.

In my field, I provide care and support from a person-centered perspective and value helping my clients feel seen, heard and understood. I provide a dynamic and personalized approach during my sessions and adapt in the moment to best support client needs. Mental health and wellness are multidimensional and personal. This remains at the core of how I view and connect with the people I help. Diagnoses and other quantifiable details are important to understanding and helping clients. However, they never tell the whole story. I love working in the realms of music therapy and therapeutic activities because there is space for clinical treatment, creative expression, personal growth, authentic connection and quality-of-life engagement.

MOST SIGNIFICANT CAREER MILESTONES

My first career milestone was deciding to study music therapy for my undergraduate degree. Once I learned this career existed, it felt like a calling to my passions for music and helping and connecting with others. In 2020, I graduated with a Bachelor of Music in Music Therapy and a Minor in Speech-Language Pathology. After completing my required clinical hours, I passed the national board certification exam and became a MT-BC that same year!

The COVID-19 pandemic made starting out in a music therapy career difficult, but through collaboration with music therapists and other professionals, I learned how to use telehealth services to reach our patients. For a while, I worked part-time as a music therapist and taught music and preschool. Another milestone was deciding to continue my education with a graduate program focusing on mental health at GCU. Eventually, the insight and skills I was gaining from my studies helped me confirm that I wanted to focus on providing music therapy and other types of therapeutic support full-time. My new clients took the place of supplemental teaching jobs.

In Fall 2024, I graduated with my Master of Science in Mental Health and Wellness with an Emphasis in Integrated Health. This degree equipped me with the knowledge and strategies to support my clients holistically. It contributes to my understanding of how feeling socially and emotionally supported can drastically improve one's health and quality of life, which informs my current practice in music therapy and therapeutic activities.

CAREER HISTORY

In high school, I knew I wanted to be a music therapist someday, so I started a club called Music Is Medicine, where I led my fellow classmates in performing musical variety shows for senior living homes, hospitals and charity/advocacy events (including Guide Dogs for the Blind). While I studied music therapy during undergraduate school, I worked as a children's gymnastics coach and a pianist for our campus' Catholic mass, always drawn to connect with and serve the community.

Once I became a MT-BC, I worked for Power of Music, LLC, a contracting music therapy company, where I provided music therapy to adults with varying disabilities and older adults with dementia. Through local and personal connections, I began to serve my own private clients and taught private music lessons (voice, piano, ukulele). While I worked on my master's degree, I cut back to working with only a couple of music therapy clients and full-time as a preschool teacher. Working in early childhood education offered me first-hand insight into child development, social-emotional learning and learning through play – which I later found to be valuable for both children and adults. Eventually, I decided to focus my career on providing therapeutic services full-time and accepted a position as a quality-of-life engagement specialist with Sage Eldercare's Hummingbird Project while continuing to see private clients. This is how I came to work with older adults with dementia and individuals with disabilities.

IMPACT ON FIELD

My professional field is newer than other mental health and health care professions, and its presence in overall health care is steadily growing due to increased research, knowledge and awareness of its effectiveness. I am one of the very few music therapists in the far East Bay Area. I impact my field by providing these services to my community, which has not had much access to them due to financial and geographical barriers. One of my major career goals is to make creative arts and recreational therapies more accessible, and one main way of doing this is through collaboration. For example, I collaborate with the Regional Center of the East Bay (RCEB), an organization that funds many kinds of services for individuals with disabilities and their families, including music therapy. I write letters of recommendation and progress notes for the RCEB so that my clients who work with them can continue to receive services without a financial burden. Additionally, I contract with local organizations that serve persons with disabilities, and I provide individualized music therapy services for our shared clients.

I impact my field through advocacy and educating others about it, such as through professional presentations, workshops for my colleagues and authentic discussions. I love learning from professionals in other fields just as much as I love sharing my impact. My favorite form of advocacy is allowing people to experience or witness music therapy's effectiveness on themselves or loved ones and having open conversations about it.

AWARDS, ACCOLADES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

In 2024, I was inducted into Alpha Chi, a national collegiate honor society that recognizes the use of academic excellence and scholarship to promote service, leadership and collaboration.

In 2019, I was honored with induction into Pi Kappa Lambda, which was awarded in recognition of outstanding musical and intellectual work done at the Conservatory of Music at the University of the Pacific. The Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society was founded in 1918, with the goal of providing recognition for outstanding accomplishments in music.¹

In 2015, I was awarded the Louis Armstrong Award. This plaque and scholarship recognize outstanding achievements in jazz, as demonstrated through superior musicianship, character and individual creativity.

I am proud to work with Futures Explored (FE), a nonprofit organization that creates equitable access to relevant programs by supporting and advocating for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. They strive to cultivate a world “where individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities have equal opportunities, are included and are empowered to make their own decisions.”² I provide music therapy services for our clients and enjoy it when our FE family runs into each other out in the community!

I also love being involved with Respite Inn, a nonprofit organization in Concord, California, that provides out-of-home respite and emergency services to adults with developmental disabilities. Respite Inn also supports the families of their guests and patients by offering regular breaks from caretaking. In weekly music therapy sessions, I foster space for guests to express themselves uniquely, connect with each other and practice social skills and emotional processing.

Additionally, I play piano and percussion and sing for the Pittsburg Community Jazz Band, based in Pittsburg, California. We perform for community events, including the annual tree lighting, senior living homes, farmers markets and charity events.

LEADERSHIP STYLE

Leadership involves guiding and collaborating with others toward a common goal. Important leadership skills include effective communication, problem-solving, building and maintaining relationships, adaptability and self-awareness.

I use these skills daily as I get to help others heal, grow and thrive using unique combinations of music therapy, therapeutic activities and authentic connection. Seek help from your mentors, colleagues and anyone else you feel has wisdom for the situation. There is always much to learn and grow in any field. You belong where you want to be!

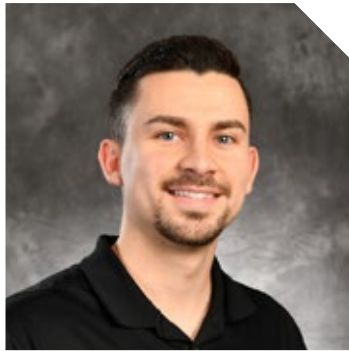

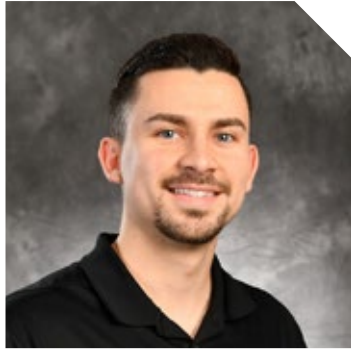

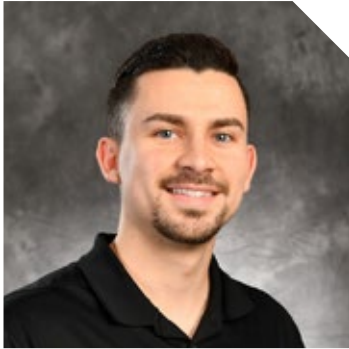

Whether it's double-checking a design, thinking through the user experience a little deeper, or simply staying present and consistent, I try to show that the small things matter. To me, leadership is about showing up every day with care, consistency and respect for the work and the people you're working alongside.

ADVICE

If I could give one piece of advice to current students or recent graduates, it would be this: take every project seriously, no matter how small it feels at the time. Especially in your upper-level courses, the work you're creating now will likely form the foundation of your first professional portfolio. Treat it with pride and intention because the habits you build now will carry forward into your career.

I'd also encourage you not to get too locked into one narrow vision of what your path has to look like. Some of the best opportunities I've had didn't look exactly like what I thought I was chasing, but they opened doors I couldn't have imagined at the time. Be open to new experiences, different industries and unexpected creative challenges. Every opportunity, even the ones that feel a little out of left field, can help shape your skills, your network and your career in ways you won't always see right away. Growth doesn't always come in a straight line, but showing up, caring about the work and being willing to learn will always take you forward.

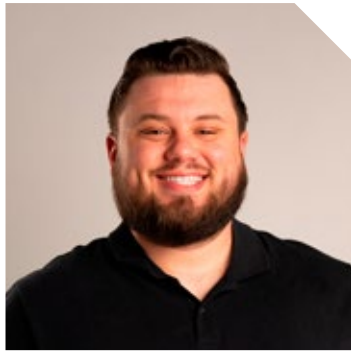

With a strong background in both live and post-production environments, I bring creativity, professionalism and a deep understanding of the media landscape to every project I undertake.

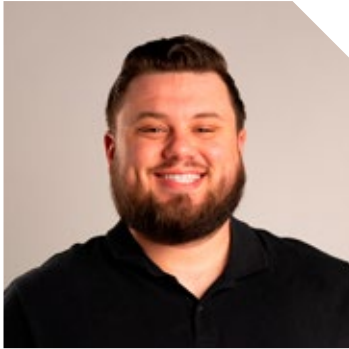
MOST SIGNIFICANT CAREER MILESTONES

ADVICE

If I could give one piece of advice to current GCU students and recent graduates, it would be this: say yes to every opportunity you can, especially the ones that stretch you outside your comfort zone. When I was at GCU, working for GCU TV all four years, I didn't always feel 100% ready for every role or responsibility, but those were the moments that helped me grow the most.

Don't wait until you feel perfectly qualified to step into a position, take on a new project or apply for a job. So much of success is about showing up, working hard, staying humble and being open to learning. The more you immerse yourself in practical experiences – internships, campus productions, side projects – the more confident and capable you'll become.

Also, build genuine relationships. Some of my most valuable career moments have come through connections I have made by being reliable, respectful and curious. People remember how you work with them, not just what you do.

Finally, stay grounded in your purpose. The media and creative industries can move fast and change quickly. Knowing why you do what you do will help you stay focused, keep your integrity and find fulfillment beyond just a title or paycheck. Your time at GCU is a launchpad – take advantage of every resource, lean into your passions and trust that your hard work will open doors you never saw coming.

My involvement with ACTRA evolved from volunteer to being appointed director of threat intelligence in 2025, allowing me to coordinate intelligence sharing across Arizona's cybersecurity communities. Previously, I shared and presented research tracking specific adversaries' operations and malware groups and open-sourced guides on hunting for these threats in various environments.

Through GitHub projects, I've created freely available tools for cybersecurity, data analysis and threat intelligence. My website (christiant.io), blog on Medium and GitHub-hosted, open-source tools serve as resources for security practitioners, offering curated training materials, cheat sheets and analysis of current threats and trends.

By combining technical contributions with education and community engagement, I work to make cybersecurity knowledge more accessible and actionable for professionals at all levels.

These connections often lead to positions that aren't publicly advertised. Look for communities with a good culture, humble motives and strong contributors like ACTRA. These organizations allow a rising tide to raise all ships across common objectives, such as lessons learned from success or failure, and can expand your organization's impact and benefit beyond what its employees alone can generate.

Build a portfolio through personal projects, professional competitions and open-source contributions. Document your work on GitHub and LinkedIn to demonstrate practical skills to employers. Develop communication abilities alongside technical expertise. The most effective professionals can translate complex concepts into business impact for different audiences.

Establish habits for continuous learning through blogs, podcasts and research papers. When facing technical challenges, develop the resilience to work through them methodically.

Give back early in your career by mentoring others and contributing to community defense efforts. My field thrives on collaboration, and your contributions will strengthen our collective security.
